I was in my bedroom; I
ran to my door, opened it
and saw a man fall behind
my brother's car, which was
parked parallel to the curb
in front of 102 Magnolia.
My brother, Arthur Howard,
"A man has been shot."

I saw the man
get up and walk to the
corner, alone; a trail of
blood was coming from his
body. He fell at the
corner of Magnoliast and
Fairview Avenue.

I saw a car ^{unmarked dark blue} with ^{white} top and ^{long} ^{crest}
several ~~men~~ men wearing
white helmets drive past

on Magnolia street, at average speed. Several people in the crowd that had gathered around the fallen man at the corner said, "Hey, Hey; stop, you shot a man," or words to this effect. At this time I saw two hands wave out of the ~~too~~ right side, and one out of the back on the left. The hands were white.

I didn't see any ~~of~~ Negro policemen in the car.

^{If I saw my brother} Arthur Howard ~~there~~ who was in the crowd at the corner of Magnolia and Fairview come back up Magnolia, get into his car & drive down to that corner.

He put the man in his
car and drove him to the
hospital.

I found out from
~~his~~ Allen Roundtree, his
brother-in-law, on Saturday
afternoon that the person
shot was Tedou Bell.
