We would like to include you and your organization in a significant unity movement which is seeking to consolidate the Black community for victory in 1970.

Thus far a relatively representative group of people has been meeting to discuss how we can most effectively unite the Black community for the mayoralty and councilmanic races in 1970. The meetings have been attended by representatives from the NAACP, Urban League, CORE, United Brothers and several other groups. Thus far we have decided a number of things which are worth mentioning:

1. We seek to organize a broad coalition of forces in the Black community that will not be dominated by any one group or ideology.

2. A convention to select candidates for offices which this coalition will support will be held from November 14 - 16, 1969.

3. A committee is being formed and election of committee officers will be held this Friday, July 11 at 7:30 p.m., Rutgers University, Conklin Hall - Room 100, 180 University Avenue.

We sincerely hope that you or a representative of your organization will be able to attend this very important meeting Friday evening.
