I, IRVIN BROWN, being duly sworn upon my oath, do depose and say:

SS:

1. That I reside at 148 Shepherd Avenue, Newark, New Jersey. I have been a resident of the City of Newark for the past (years.

2. That I am presently and have been employed by A. C. Transformer, 89 Madison Street, Newark, New Jersey, for the past 2 years.

3. That on July 15, 1967, I was visiting with my brother, Ozel Brown, and his family, at his residence, at 298 Bergen Street, Newark, New Jersey.

4. That approximately 6:00 P.M., on July 15, 1967, my nephews' returned to their house, at 298 Bergen Street, and stated that they had been told by the police that everyone must get off the streets as the police were going to come down the street at approximately 6:00 P.M. and were going to be shooting in the street.

5. That in response to the aforesaid statement I went to the window of the apartment to instruct my brother, Ozel Brown, who had been sitting in the street outside of his apartment at 298 Bergen Street, to come into the house.

6. That when I approached the window, I glanced down Springfield Avenue and observed the National Guard and the New Jersey State Troopers shooting at undetermined targets. 7. That immediately thereafter, I observed a convoy of National Guardsmen and New Jersey State Troopers coming up Bergen Street and approaching 298 Bergen Street.

8. That as soon as the aforesaid convoy had arrived at 298 Bergen Street the firing which had been taking place on Springfield Avenue became significantly more rapid. Apparently in response to the intensification of the shooting by the National Guardsmen and State Troopers on Springfield Avenue, the convoy of National Guardsmen and State Troopers in front of 298 Bergen Street came to an immediate halt and began to arbitrarily fire their guns in the direction of all of the buildings in the immediate area. I neither heard nor observed any shooting in this area until the National Guard and State Troopers opened fire.

9. That as soon as the National Guard and State Troopers began to fire I felt a bullet from one of their guns pass directly over my head and embed itself somewhere within the apartment.

10. That I immediately fell back into the room and instructed my sister-in-law, Mrs. Rebecca Brown and her 4 children, to get away from the window and to take cover.

11. That I observed my sister-in-law, Rebecca Brown, approach the window and grab her child, Della Brown, age 2, and turn to retreat from the window. As Mrs. Rebecca Brown turned from the window she was struck either in the back or the side from rifle fire which had come through the window.

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12. That she immediately fell to the floor. She was dead before the ambulance arrived approximately 30 minutes later.

13. That the barrage of shooting lasted approximately 15 or 20 minutes.

14. That sometime after the Guardsmen and Troopers ceased firing I observed that most of the neighboring buildings had been badly shot up.

15. That approximately 7:30 P.M., July 15, 1967, I was returning from the hospital where I had gone to pickup Willie Leroy Brown, who had accompanied the body of Rebecca Brown.

That as I was returning home from the hospital with 16. the aforesaid Willie Leroy Brown; my brother, Ozel Brown; his 4 children; his sister, Gladys; and my 2 children, I was driving on Littleton Avenue at the Springfield Avenue cross section, when I heard the sound of a rifle shot and felt the right rear tire of my automobile go flat. immediately looked through the rear view mirror of my automobile and observed a National Guardsmen standing some distance behind my car, holding a rifle which was aimed at the The bullet I later determined' had struck the trunk, car. gone through the truck, and struck the tire. When I passed the aforesaid Guardsman I was not signaled to stop nor was there any indication that I should identify myself. The shooting was without warning and without provocation.

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17. That in view of what had transpired during the course of the evening my only response to this last incident was to leave as quickly as possible so as to safeguard my life and the lives of the passengers in my automobile.

18. That all of the above is true to the best of my knowledge, information and belief.
