Black brothers and sisters of Newark, this date that you see above could be the greatest day in the History of the Black People here in Newark, but even more important this day could be the greatest day for Black People all over America. This day could signal the END of the OLD and the BEGINNING of the NEW, but first it means that all of Black Newark must get behind it and support it. On May 14, 1967, a UNITY MEETING of Black people from all walks of life, from all the various religions, from all the many black organizations, some of those even within the system, many more outside of it, but the one thing that we all had in common, was that we were Black and TIRED; TIRED of being flunkies, Toms and Puppets. TIRED of being told by the MAFIA government that we have to move out of one slum area into another slum area, because they have decided that the city of Newark needs a Medical School for white America's children, with no concern whatever given for the rotten housing conditions that we must raise our children in, with no concern for the rotten schools, and the rotten education that our children are receiving, with no concern for the high rents and high taxes that we must pay to raise our children in these hog-like conditions to be killed and slaughtered in RIOTS and Viet Nam. Black Newark must rise and take a stand now.
