

# Should Run This Town, Carmichael Harangues

**NEWARK** — Without using the explosive "black power" slogan he's credited with coining, Stokely Carmichael last week spelled out for the benefit of street-rally audiences what Negroes should do in a city where they are the majority group.

"There's no reason you shouldn't run this town lock, stock and barrel," the controversial chairman of the militant Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee told the first of his two audiences, an orderly group of some 400 persons.

He told another gathering in Central Ward, the Negro community, that Negroes "should already have taken Newark, N.J., over because it belongs to you."

## Not Afraid

"In all other cities, they're afraid of rebellion," the 25-year-old civil rights leader declared. "But in Newark, N.J., they're not even afraid of you."

Negroes, he continued, should control city government, the schools, the police and all businesses. They should take over City Hall, raise taxes so high white property owners will be forced to turn over their holdings for little or nothing to Negroes.

The tall, slender SNCC leader told his audience, which included city officials as well as black nationalists, "it's white power that keeps us bounded in the ghetto, and we need black power to break out."

## Power Counts

"We've got to move to control our communities because

nothing counts in this country but power," he added.

Dr. Martin Luther King "has got to march and get hit on the head with rocks in order to be able to live next to savages," the youthful SNCC leader stated.

Commenting on white friendship and help, he said: "We don't want you as our friend because it costs too much."

On the issue of police civilian review boards, he flatly stated: "All we need is to control the police captain on the local level."
