While driving down Hawthorne Ave., the car, containing Mr. and Mrs. Moss, Eddie, brothers, Clarence, 9, Michael, 6, and Jerry, 4, and James Cannon, brother of Mr. Moss, approached a roadblock patroled by Nat. Guardsmen.

Moss thought it was st. repair.

"I was doing about 35 and when I saw the roadblock, I slowed down to about 10," said Moss. "A gun went off and I mashed down on the gas. I thought they were tying to kill everybody in the car."

1Moss decided to run the roadblock. At the same time, Cannon frantically waved his hands at the Guardsmen in an attemOt to stop the shooting.

The firing continued and the Moss car crashed through a second barricade about 10 ymards away. 1Moss picked up tremendous speed at this point, perhaps traveling 90-100 miles per hour.

After driving several blocks to apparent safety, Clarence told the others that Eddie had been shot.

Cannon said there was a huge hold in the back of the boy's head and his brains were sca**see**red all over the back seat where he was sitting.

Moss stopped and immediately lay his son on the widewalk and called the fire dept. He felt him still breathing. The boy died at City Hospital
