

Black Power meeting plans 14 workshops

Fourteen workshops have been set for the four-day National Conference on Black Power which begins tomorrow at the Military Park Hotel and the Cathedral House, Newark.

Dr. Nathan Wright, conference chairman, said every workshop will concern itself with questions of why Negroes have not been able to stand on their own and how Negroes might add fully their unused power for the enrichment of the lives of all.

THE PARTICIPANTS

Dr. Wright emphasized that the conference would "defeat its own purpose if it focused upon the imperfections in the white community."

Workshop participants will include Attorney Paul Zuber of Croton-on-Hudson in New York; John F. Davis, past national first vice president of the National Association for

the Advancement of Colored People; Rev. William Eichelberger, resident chaplain at Newark, Rutgers, and Dr. James P. Comer of the Yale Child Development Center and Mrs. Bonnie Barrow, national secretary of the Congress of Racial Equality.

Among other Negro leaders listed to attend is Adam Clayton Powell. Wright neither confirmed nor denied if Powell planned to attend the conference.

Wright said only that Powell has been registered among those expected to attend.

Dr. Wright said the conference has been designed to explore only the issue of empowerment for self-directed efforts at self-sufficiency and self-respect.

He noted that the riots point to the need for many new and hitherto unexplored forms of communication.
