

## CONFERENCE IN NEWARK

# Black Power meetings will be held

The National Conference on Black Power will be held in Newark beginning Thursday. It was announced yesterday by Rev. Dr. Nathan Wright Jr., conference chairman.

The meeting will be held at the Military Park Hotel and the Cathedral House.

Dr. Wright, who is director

of urban work for the Episcopal Diocese of Newark, said yesterday he didn't know if Adam Clayton Powell planned to address the four-day conference.

He said, however, that comedian Dick Gregory, Sen. Herman Hollaway of Wilmington, Del. and Arthur Hodgeco,

secretary of the Progressive Labor Party of Bermuda, will be among those attending.

Earlier, Gov. Richard J. Hughes had urged that the Black Power conference be moved elsewhere. He said this was neither the State nor the place for such a gathering and added, "I would like to

make a serious and respectful appeal not to have it here."

Wright said that it was possible all conference sessions would be closed to the public.

He said the sessions were being considered closed because of the disturbances in Newark.
