The Executive Board of Newark-Essex CORE today expressed grave concern about the safety of children in many of Newark's schools during the teachers' strike. Fred Means, the Chapter Chairman, said that he had telephoned Mayor Addonizio demanding that the schools be closed until a settlement has been negotiated. Means said, " We have received reports that children have been running rampant in several schools and that many children either are not being supervised at all or are in the hands of unqualified people. Closing the schools during the period of crisis seems to be the only way to insure the safety of the children of Newark. If the Mayor and the teachers' organizations have not arrived at an agreement by Monday morning, the schools should not open, and for the safety of our children, should remain closed until an agreement is reached."
