The demonstration took place alternately, in front of each building. Only about half a dozen demonstrators were residents of the buildings. The rest were representatives of the neighborhood group and members of Students for Democratic Society, here on a summer project in connection and civil rights

The demonstrators were armed with signs complaining of rats in the buildings and other unsanitary conditins. Last Monday

the two buildings were included in a tour of slum sections by Mayor Hugh J. Addonizio.

Ralphael Shustak, an owner of the building in Clinton Aves charged after the demonstration that he is being "harassed" by Clinton Hill group. He claimed that they are interested only in publicity, and have refused to accept his offer to discuss the dispute.
