END JOB DISCRIPTINATION

AGAINST NEGROES AND PUERTO RICANS

The building trades unions working at the Barringer School site are guilty of the most flagrant discrimination against nonwhite workers. Recently, only 15 of the 186 workers on this project (8%) were Negro—and virtually all were assigned to unskilled jobs. Fair hiring appeals have been ignored by the unions. City officials are allowing construction to continue—despite the fact that minority group tax money is helping finance the project.

The Newark Coordinating Council is asking that 65% of the new workers hired for this project and for apprenticeship programs be Negroes or Puerto Ricans, until the nonwhite workers have reached 50% of the total work force.
