Newark's anti-poverty program is one of the best known in the nation.

It has been successful because it has not been controlled by City Hall and politicians fighting among themselves for government money.

Tonight there is a proposal to add 19 new representatives of the City Administration giving Mayor Addonizio and City Hall 26 people on the Board of Trustees.

Most of these people will come from City Agencies that for the past 10 years have done little to help solve the big problems of poverty here in Newark.

The proposal includes giving the Area Boards 27 new Trustees. This is good, because the Area Boards can put more poor people on the Board of Trustees.

It is possible to vote for the 27 Area Board representatives without voting for the representatives of City Hall. You can have one without the other.

This is our anti-poverty program. Don't hand it over to City Hall.
